# **Approval of Minutes:**

The Authority reviewed the minutes from the December 13, 2023 open meeting. There were no amendments made to the minutes. Member Dudley made a motion to approve the minutes. Member Jennings seconded the motion. The motion carried by acclamation.

### Approval of Quarterly Financial Reports:

The Executive Director provided the combined financial statements for October, November & December 2023. He reported that the October Operating Account had a balance of \$264,620.48 and the same month's Education and Outreach Account had a balance of \$1116,125.75. The November Operating Account had a balance of \$245,658.38 and the Education and Outreach Account had a balance of \$111,785.07. There were no filing fees or fines for November. The December Operating Account had a balance of \$259,875.38, and the Education & Outreach Fund had a balance of \$113,343.88 There were \$200 in filings fees collected and no fines received.

In addition, year-to-date (November 2023) revenue from the 5 Cent per outgoing ticket surcharge is \$115,055.25, which is \$2,426.40 less than the same period in 2022. The year-to-date legal expenditures total \$1,698.50, which were primarily for general matters and legislative issues. The 3-year to-date legal fee totals total is \$41,908.00. Chairman Gaines made a motion to accept the October, November, December 2023 (4<sup>th</sup> Quarter) financial reports, which was seconded by member Dudley. The motion carried by acclamation.
